



Subway 10th Annual One-Design Small Boat Invitational Regatta

July 25th & 26th, 2009

NOTICE OF RACE

Laser, Laser Radial, Byte, 29er, 420, Optimist, Master Laser

1 Venue

1.1 The Subway 10th Annual One-Design Small Boat Invitational Regatta is organized by the Able Sail/Handi-Voile Inc., the Shediac Bay Sailing School, Shediac Bay Yacht Racing Association in conjunction with the New Brunswick Sailing Association and will be held in Shediac Harbour out of the Shediac Bay Municipal Marina.

2 Eligibility

2.1 This regatta is an open event subject to showing proof of membership in a CYA member Club or CYA Sailing School.

3 Classes

3.1 Competitors are expected to bring their own boats. This event is open to the following classes.

Single-Handed Laser Male/Female
Single-Handed Laser Radial Male/Female
Single-Handed Byte Male/Female
Single-Handed CII Male/Female
Single-Handed Optimist Male/Female
Double-Handed 29er Male/Female
Double-Handed 420 Male/Female
Single-Handed Master Laser Male/Female

3.2 Other classes may be accepted providing acceptance by the organizing authority and a minimum of four (4) boats register.

4 Rules

4.1 The regatta will be governed by the 2009 – 2012 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of the Canadian Yachting Association, the rules of the 29er, 49er, Laser, Laser Radial, Byte, 420, Optimist and Master Laser classes; except as any of these are changed by the Notice of Race or by the Sailing Instructions.

5 Entries

5.1 Eligible boats may be entered by completing registration with the organizing authority in accordance with the Notice of Race. Entry Fees are **\$50.00** for single-handed boats and **\$70.00** for double-handed boats, **\$20.00** for coaches and **\$10.00** for accompanying parents.

5.2 Registration includes on the water lunch provided both days, and a dinner provided Saturday upon completion of the day's racing. A hamburger BBQ is provided Sunday afternoon following completion of races.

5.3 Registration will take place at the Shediac Bay Municipal Marina, Sailing School on Saturday, July 25, 2009 from 08:30 A.M. until 10 :00 A.M.

5.4 Make cheques payable to Able Sail / Handi- Voile Inc.

6 Prizes

6.1 Prizes will be awarded to the top three (3) finishers in each class.

7 Sailing Instructions

7.1 Sailing Instructions will be made available to competitors at registration and will be posted on the official notice board located at the SBYC clubhouse.

8 Schedule of Races

8.1 Nine races are scheduled, of which 1 race must be completed to constitute a series.

8.2 Races are scheduled as follows :

Saturday - Skippers Meeting 1000 hrs
Saturday - First Race 1100 hrs
Sunday - First Race 1100 hrs

No warning signal will be made after 1430 hrs on the last day of racing.

8.3 All subsequent races after the first race of the day will be started as soon as practical after the conclusion of the preceding race.

9 Support boats

9.1 All coaches and athlete support personnel attending shall respect the CYA Coaches' Code of Conduct.

9.2 Except to assist a boat in distress requiring assistance, support boats of team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall not be within 50 meters of the racing area of any course from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start until all boats have finished or the race committee has signalled a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

10 Safety

10.1 All participants are required to wear personal buoyance. (Amends RRS 40).

10.2 A 5-m. by 7-mm painter line must be attached to each yacht's mast.

11 Discipline

11.1 All competitors, coaches and chaperones shall comply with the CYA Code. When a protest establishes a violation of these guidelines, the Jury may reject or cancel the entry of a boat or exclude a competitor from further competition at any time. This modifies RRS 76.1.
